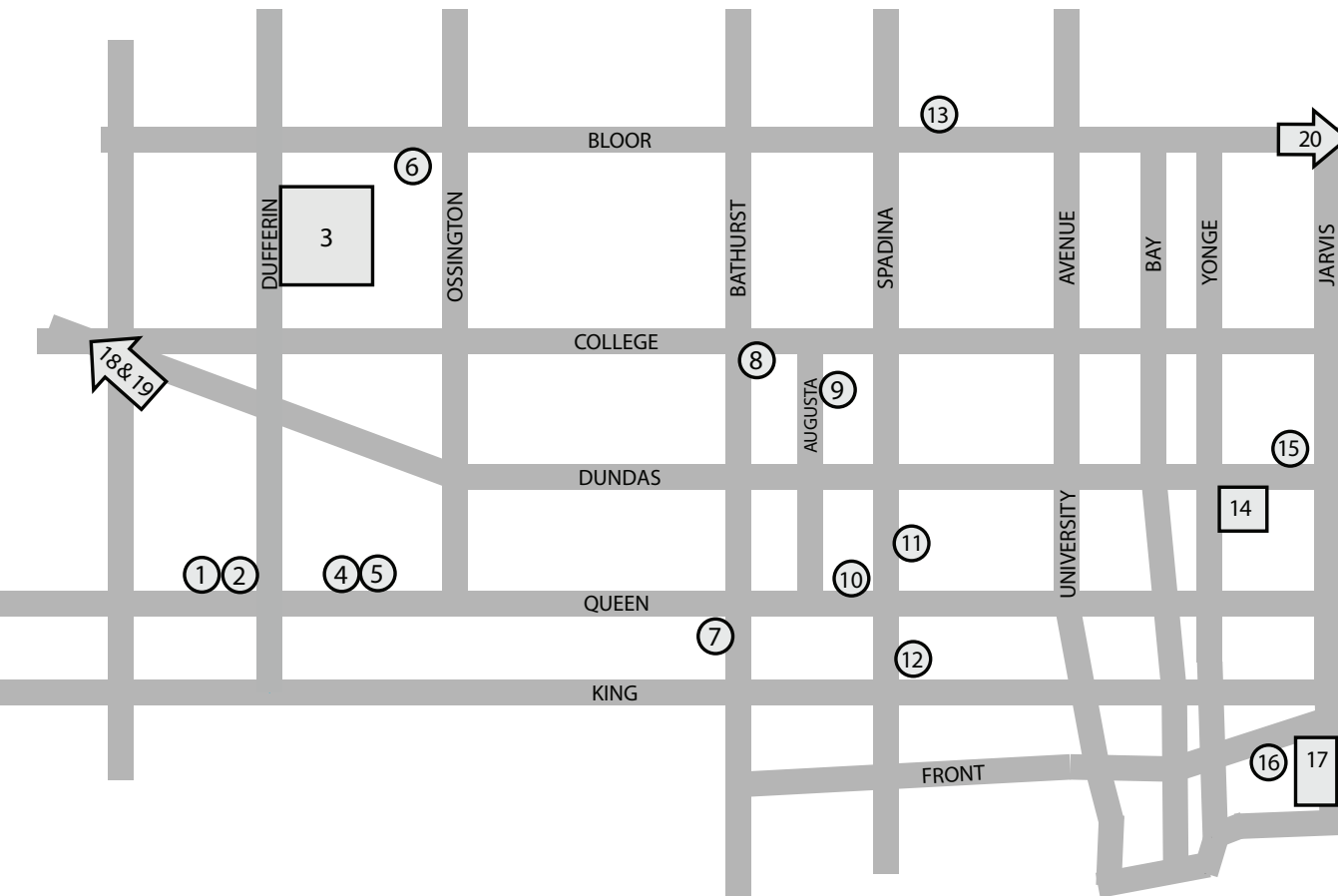

How to connect

To use the Wireless Toronto network, you must be at a Wireless Toronto venue. A list and map of venues is on the interior of this brochure. Using your WiFi-enabled device (laptop, PDA, etc.), connect to the wireless network called wirelessstoronto. Open your web browser and connect to any page; you will be redirected to the Wireless Toronto login page.

If you already have a Wireless Toronto account, enter your username and password in the login form. Once logged in, you'll be taken to the community portal page; you're now connected to the Internet.

If it's your first time connecting to the Wireless Toronto network, click "create free account" to make an account for yourself. You need to specify a valid email address. Once you've created the account, log in with your new username and password. If your login was successful, you will see the community portal page; you are now connected to the Internet. You should immediately check your email for the validation email. Click the link in that email within 15 minutes, or your account will be disabled.

How to get help

If you're having trouble connecting to the Wireless Toronto network, you should first ensure that your WiFi device is working, ideally by connecting to a different wireless network; a friend's home or office network, for example. Until you can get your device working on another wireless network, we don't recommend attempting to connect to the Wireless Toronto network.

If you're still having trouble connecting, you could inquire with someone else at the venue using a laptop—they may have some advice.

If you're unable to get online and have access to a telephone, you can leave us a message at 647-722-3567. As a volunteer group we cannot guarantee how quickly we'll get back to you. We'll do our best. If you're able to get online by some other means—or later on—email us at support@wirelessstoronto.ca.
